Healthy Heads is committed to making our industry the best-ranked sector for mental health and wellbeing in Australia, but we have a way to go.

It is hard to believe another 12 months have gone by, but what an incredible 12 months it has been for Healthy Heads, despite the continuing challenges faced by our sector.

The 2023-2024 financial year has seen the launch of our third annual R U OK? in Trucks & Sheds National Day of Action, as well as the extension of the Road Show program into the Pilbara region of Western Australia. We have continued to develop a variety of resources to ensure that people working in road transport, warehousing and logistics have their physical and psychosocial needs met. These resources include the Roadmap Planner, the delivery of a suite of free mental health training courses, and the extension of our nutrition program into sheds, increasing nutrition awareness and encouraging healthy eating behaviours.

We at Healthy Heads understand that people working in our sector are the backbone of this country and must be protected at all costs. That is why we have continued to develop key partnerships with mental health experts such as Lifeline Australia, Black Dog Institute,

AP Psychology & Consulting Services, and Mental Health First Aid Australia, who are dedicated to delivering tailored support to the sector.

As always, we must thank our new and existing Corporate Partners and Supporters for another fantastic year. Your steadfast commitment to ensuring that mental health and wellbeing remain at the forefront of our sector is invaluable, and it's important to note that nothing we've achieved at Healthy Heads over the last four years would have been possible without your support. 

The Healthy Heads Road Show has completed a full national event schedule during the 2023-2024 financial year, it's busiest one to date!

The Road Show truck provided by Foundation Partner PACCAR Australia continues to be one of our most popular programs providing the opportunity for people in the sector to connect face-to-face with Healthy Heads right across the country.

From July 2023 – June 2024 Healthy Heads hosted **29 Road Show events** across NSW, SA, VIC and WA connecting with 2722 people and involving 20 organisations.

A highlight in this years schedule was the Road Show tour of WA with 11 events held in Kalgoorlie, Perth, Kewdale, Muchea, Karratha and Port Hedland. There was excitement and engagement across all events which demonstrated the importance of reaching

regional and remote locations, where truck drivers and other transport and logistics members are located. Healthy Heads is committed to extending its presence further across the country in coming years.

Healthy Heads engaged Worksite Fitness & Rehabilitation (WFR) to conduct free health screenings at Road Show events in 2024, which is proving to be a beneficial collaboration. The heath health screenings are proving to be very popular, and their availability is adding real value as the screenings link seamlessly into Healthy Heads team member conversations about wellbeing and the tailored resources that are available to support both their physical and mental health.

The reach and ongoing demand for the Road Show demonstrates the value of face-to-face engagement as we continue to raise awareness and reduce stigma around mental health. 2,700+

R U OK? in Trucks & Sheds 2024

The 2024 R U OK? in Trucks & Sheds National Day of Action was held on the 14 May 2024 with the new theme-"Ask R U OK? No qualifications needed".

"Ask R U OK? – No qualifications needed" aims to break through stigma and highlight that you don't need to be qualified counsellor to check in with a colleague or friend.

With growth in participation, this year Healthy Heads focused on supporting our network of Company Champions to lead activities within their organisations.

218 Company Champions led events across the industry to share resources, messages, and assist people who might be doing it tough, in addition to educating people on how and when to ask, 'R U OK?".

Roadmap Planner

In 2023, state and federal authorities updated WHS regulations to include codes of practice for managing the risk of psychosocial hazards in the workplace.

In response Healthy Heads developed the Roadmap Planner to aid better understanding of psychological health and safety, and to assist businesses of all sizes in transport, warehousing, and logistics to establish a Workplace Wellbeing Plan to help meet their work health and safety (WHS) duty of care to manage psychosocial hazards at work.

The Roadmap Planner is built upon the Seven Workplace Strategies outlined in the National Mental Health & Wellbeing Roadmap. By implementing these seven strategies, organisations can create their own Plan to protect and support their employees.

Drawn from real-life experiences, the stories in the Planner reveal the purpose of each workplace strategy. Each story is followed by a series of statements to consider that help identify gaps in your current approach or understanding of a strategy. Links then take you to resources to help you fill these gaps and build your own plan.

The Planner also provides example Workplace Wellbeing Plans ready to apply and customise to your own work environment or business.

Nutrition Program

Our key nutrition program ambitions are to increase awareness of healthy eating, increase access to and the consumption of healthier options and to encourage long term healthy eating behaviour change throughout the industry.

The Healthy Heads Nutrition Program has achieved some significant outcomes in the last 12 months:

- Choose Healthy and Save menu with bp
- **Nutrition in Sheds supported** by Charter Hall, and
- Be Fit Food Trial

These programs and trials inform our approach and see the development of program methodologies that can be applied broadly across transport, warehousing and logistics work environments.

Highlights:

bp Choose Healthy and Save

In partnership with Foundation Partner bp, this program offers a Healthier Choices Menu at 31 bp Service Centre locations across the country, via the Healthy Heads App developed with input from Nutrition Australia. Discounts are applied to meals on a rotating basis.

Almost 30,000 meals purchased to date (since Aug 2022)

Nutrition in Sheds

The Nutrition in Sheds initiative includes the sharing of educational information, along with the modification of on-site canteens, cafés and kiosks enabling increased access to healthier foods.

- Two warehouses launched trial nutrition programs that will reach over 500 warehousing team members
- Trial of the Healthy Heads Healthier Choice badge – making choosing healthy easier
- Program and healthier choice options advised by Nutrition Australia

The long-term goal of this project, and all Healthy Heads' nutrition work, is to raise the bar on access to healthier food choices across the sector and the country in truck stops, roadhouses, distribution centres and warehouses

Be Fit Food Trial

The Be Fit Food trial saw 8 warehousing team members and 10 heavy vehicle drivers provided with a six week supply of Be Fit Food, healthy pre-prepared meals and snacks.

The participants completed a medical test prior to and after the program. During the program participants were offered educational content and met with a dietitian for a fortnightly phone coaching session.

- **54 dietician sessions** attended by trial participants
- **1,080 healthy meals** provided to participants free of charge
- 4 recorded dietitian run webinars produced
- An **evaluation** of the program is in progress

Mental Health Training

Free courses on offer to help keep heads healthy.





Resourcing a workplace in mental health and wellbeing training can be challenging but is critical to capacity building in the sector.

If we want people to have conversations about mental health, and to check in with a colleague who might be doing it tough, we must equip them with the knowledge, skills, resources and confidence to do so.

Healthy Heads secured funding via the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator's Heavy Vehicle Safety Initiative to offer over 600 places in free training during 2024 focusing on small to medium businesses and regional areas.

These industry-specific courses are delivered by expert organisations including Lifeline Australia, Black Dog Institute, Steering Healthy Minds, Mental Health First Aid Australia, and AP Psychology & Consulting Services.

Training course options range in length from one hour to a two-day course and are available both online and face-to-face.






